# WACONICHI LAKE FLOATING CABINS INFORMATION GUIDE

#### FLOATING CABINS PACKAGE

#### Location

2 floating cabins, site 1 and 2, located on the water in Cliff Bay, near the beach with view on the cliffs

Arrival : 3PM

Departure : 12PM

#### Fees

300\$ / chalet / jour - Maximum 4 personnes - MINIMUM 2 nuits

#### **Comment s'y rendre**

#### How to get there

- Access by the hiking trail from the Gazebo, then by canoe (hiking of 700 m to get to the beach). Canoes, kayaks et paddle board on site. Parking at km 7 of the access road.
- Access by the boat launch at km 255 of the 167 Road if you bring your own motor boat. 5 km from the floating cabins. Parking at the boat launch, follow the directives.
- Access by the Waconichi lake site if you bring your own canoe/kayak or you take Nibiischii's boat (motor non-included, but renting on site available). 3 km, 45 min to 1 hour in canoe.

#### Package

- Boat included (motor non-included) and possibility to bring your own boat
- Eco-tourism package, including outdoors activities
- Fishing rights not included

\*Discount on the package of 7 nights and more offered for the whole season.

Maximum of 4 people per group (children included).

#### **Products and services**

2 floating cabins (12 x 24 ft Coolboxes- 24 x 30 ft floating platform) equipped with: 4 single, bunk, wooden beds, a sofa bed (can accommodate 1 child), pillows, shower, propane toilet, 1 rectangular table with 4 chairs, board games, propane refrigerator/freezer (6 cu. ft.), propane cooktop, dishes (8 place settings), dish soap, pots and pans, coffee maker, kettle, toaster, utensils, storage cabinet, broom, dustpan and mop. Hammock, 6 ft. front and back porch, boat mooring on the platform, bistro table and 2 chairs for outside, closed outside storage.

Storage also available under the left bed.



Note that you need to bring your bedding (sheets, sleeping, pillowcase, etc.), shower, dish, and tea towels.

INTEGRATED EQUIPMENT AND SYSTEMS: The cabin is equipped with a propane heating system, a propane water heater, solar panels for lighting and power outlets, a water tank, a grey water recovery pump.

#### Safety

- > SPOT dispositive are available to ensure safety of visitors on water and in the floating cabins
- Detailed maps of the lake are available in the cabins. Also available on the Avenza App. (link for downloads will soon be available)

#### Activities

- Hiking, stand up paddle board (SUP), kayak, canoe, swimming, star gazing, board games;
- Canoe, SUP, and kayak on site and included in the package.



#### What to bring

Food for the duration of the stay (no food sold on site)

Bedding (sheets, blankets or sleeping bag)

Bath towels, dish towels and table cloths

Soap and shampoo (sulfate-free)

Suggested to bring your own emergency communication device for your safety

#### About Waconichi Lake Cabin Site

Welcome: Check-in at Waconichi welcoming office

Open from 7AM to 10PM

**Location:** 30 km from Chibougamau - KM 4 of the Route du Nord, follow the signs (8 km), total of about 12 km on gravel road

Arrangement : 11 chalets with a capacity of 4 persons

2 floating cabins with a capacity of 4 persons

#### Services available on site

Waconichi welcoming office - 7AM to 10PM, 7 days/7 in summer

Evisceration shelter with running water


Boat launch for personal boat not on site - KM 255 of route 167, 3 km from Rupert's office



# **INFORMATIONS**

Please take into account that there are several users of the site and the lake. We are not responsible for stolen or broken objects during your stay, remember to lock the door before leaving to avoid any incident.

#### Check in and keys

Check in is to be done at the Waconichi welcoming office. You will receive the keys as well as other information for your stay

#### Boats

Be sure to secure boats to the floating dock and use fenders to prevent breakage!

#### Propane Toilet - Rely on the paper taped to the toilet lid.

1.Fold up the seat and flap. The fan starts automatically.

2.Place a bag in the bowl. Remember to use a new bag each time you use the toilet

3.Lower the seat. The toilet is ready to use

4. If there is little waste, add a cup of water so that the bag is heavy enough to fall out

5.Lower the flapper

6.Press the Start button. Incineration starts when the yellow light is on.

\*Always place a new bag in the toilet bowl.

\*The toilet lid must always be down when the toilet is not in use. Incineration does not take place until the lid is down.

\*Incineration may take up to three hours after the last visit.

\*The fan continues to run until the incineration is complete and the internal temperature of the toilet returns to the normal range. The cooling process may take up to 90 minutes after the incineration is completed.

\*The propane toilet can be used at any time during the incineration or cooling process. Incineration is interrupted during use. Be sure to press the Start/Stop button at the end of each use.

#### All sanitary waste must be disposed of in the trash, not in the propane toilet

#### Electricity

The Coolbox is powered solely by solar panels that recharge a battery bank. Do not leave lights or other devices requiring electricity on when not needed.



#### **PAY ATTENTION TO WATER MANAGEMENT!**

Grey water is stored in a tank behind the Coolbox (1000 liters). Do not let the water run unnecessarily (sink or shower).

The water in the tank is not potable, it comes from the lake.

#### **First Aid**

A first aid kit is located above the refrigerator. If you use it or take something from it, please notify a Waconichi employee so that we can replace the missing items.

#### **Heating system**

#### To turn on heating, make sure the pilot is light

To light the pilot: turn the wheel on top so that the arrow points to *Pilot*. Push it down and then push the button at the right of the wheel. When you see a flame, keep pushing both for 30 seconds, then release. DO it again and maintain longer if the flame does not stay.

To adjust heating: when the pilot is light, turn the wheel anti-clockwise to increase the temperature

#### **Departure**

Please leave the premises as you found them, i.e. clean and in good condition, thank you. If a breakage or problem occurs, please do not hesitate to speak to the Waconichi Cottages site manager.

#### Electricity

Make sure all lights and appliances are turned off. Turn off the refrigerator too.

#### Toilet

Ensure that the incineration of the last bag is started or completed before leaving

#### Trash

Bring back your garbage bags at the containers located at the Waconichi site

#### Windows

Make sure to close all windows before leaving

#### Dishes

Make sure that the dishes used are clean and tidy, as they were when you arrived

#### Keys

Please leave the keys at the front desk of the Waconichi Lake site upon your return. The cabins must be vacated by 12PM.

#### NO ANIMAL IS ALLOWED IN THE CABINS OR ON THE PLATFORMS

"Outdoor activities can involve some risk. You must therefore always ensure that you have the skills and abilities required for the activity you choose. It is very important to be aware of the risks inherent to this activity, to know and respect your abilities and to have the appropriate equipment, when required."

Federal regulations prohibit anyone from operating a motorized vessel unless they have proof of having successfully completed a boating safety course in Canada prior to April 1, 1999 or a Pleasure Craft Operator Card issued following the successful completion of a Transport Canada approved test.

As stipulated in the Wildlife Area Regulations, any person who engages in fishing activity must, upon leaving the wildlife area, report the activity to the place determined for this purpose, indicating the daily catch. Any violation of this regulation constitutes an offence and is punishable by a minimum fine of \$250.
