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#### INFORMATION YOU NEED TO MAKE YOUR RESERVATION

1 ADULT MUST BE RESPECTED AT ALL TIMES!

\*\*\* Rustic camping (without fishing) is no longer permitted in wildlife reserves for safety reasons and lack of ressources to ensure the surveillance of the territory (noaching).

Booking of \$500 or more: Possible to request a payment plan (max of 3 instalment

payments).

1st payment: 30%

Payment 2nd payment: 20% minimum

3rd payment: The balance must be paid the month before your stay (at least 1 month

before the beginning of your stay).

Less than \$500: The total cost must be paid upon booking.

### MODIFICATION OR CANCELLATION OF YOUR RESERVATION

## Less than 7 days before the beginning of the stay:

\* Availability of Services: Please note that if the management restricts or prohibits access to a water body, a trail, a path, or cancels an activity for reasons beyond its control, no modification or cancellation will be accepted and no refund will be granted.

\*\* Special Weather Conditions: Please note that if lakes are not thawed before the beginning of the season, or if bad weather prevents preparation of the sites before the opening, no changes or cancellations will be accepted and no refund will be granted. Thank you for your understanding!

IMPORTANT INFORMATION		
REGISTRATION	Rupert Welcoming Office	From Chibougamau, Route 167 leads to the Rupert Welcoming Office of the AMW Wildlife Reserve (a distance of 20 km)  OPENING HOURS: Monday to Sunday, 7am to 5pm
ACCESS TO RUSTIC CAMPGROUNDS - Lakes Cachisca, Comencho and Opataca	Access roads, such as Routes 32 and 42, are occasionally maintained by forestry companies working in the area, or by Hydro-Québec. In any case, travelling on such roads requires some experience and a vehicle with a ground clearance of at least 18 cm (7 inches). Also take note that branches often rub on your vehicle and that the width of meeting points are insufficient.	
* Please note that there is no staff on the site.		
FISHING - CAMPING PACKAGE

Fishing - Camping	The Right of Access Passes are issued on a 24-hour basis and are valid from the time of issuance upon arrival, until the same time on the day of departure. You will have to pay the access fees for the entire group, for the total duration of your stay. In case of late check-out, each member of the group will have to pay the fees for an additional daily fishing pass. The confirmation of your reservation is NOT a Right of Access Pass! The Right of Access Passes are issued via the Rupert Welcoming Office and these can be sent to you by fax or e-mail. Please ask for more details.	
Non-potable Water!	It is recommended to bring clean water or to boil water available on site for 10 to 20 minutes.	
USE OF EQUIPMENTS PROVIDED	* We remind you that you must use with care and diligence the accessories or equipment that are made available to you during your stay. If you notice that any equipment or accessory is missing or defective, please stop using it and report it promptly to a staff member on-site. Any damage or injury resulting from the use of damaged or inadequate equipment or accessories is the sole responsibility of the user.	
PROTECTION OF THE ENVIRONMENT		
On the Water	To help us preserve our water bodies, make sure your boating equipment is free of invasive aquatic species.	
Do not move the firewood!	Campers who bring their own firewood can accidentally spread the insects found there and endanger the native species of parks and reserves. To prevent this, campers are asked NOT to bring firewood for campfires. <b>LEAVE YOUR FIREWOOD AT HOME AND BUY IT LOCALLY FOR YOUR STAY</b> . This will prevent the spreading of invasive species.	
Garbages	Provide a bag to bring back your garbage at home or throw it away in the designated areas. When you leave, there should be no garbage on or near your campsite. No waste should remain in the fireholes.	
* Anyone who breaches these rules can be expelled on the spot, without refund.		
PREVENTION		
FIRE SAFETY	Campfires or cooking fires are permitted only in the supervision of a responsible person.	n areas designed for this purpose and must be extinguished before bedtime. At all times, they must be kept under
ROAD SAFETY	Since the distance to be traveled on gravel road	is is considerable, it is strongly recommended to bring two (2) inflated spare tires.
NAUTICAL SAFETY, BOATS AND MOTORS	According to the federal regulations in force, <u>it i</u>	is forbidden to use a boat unless it carries on board, and in good condition, the following equipment:  - Personnal flotation devices in sufficient quantity  - A buoyant heaving line of at least 15 m  - A waterproof flashlight or 3 pyrotechnic signals if the boat is motorized  - Whistle or sound signaling device  - A bailer or hand pump  - A manual propulsion device
* You must provide the required equipment, which can be rented or purchased on-site. Federal Regulations prohibits anyone from operating a motorboat unless proving having passed a Boating Safety Course in Canada before April 1st, 1999, or possessing the Pleasure Craft Operator Card issued by Transport Canada following the successful completion of an Approved Boating Safety Course. If you do not have such proof of competence and would like to rent a motorized boat, you will need to complete a security checklist when renting. For more information, visit the Office of Boating Safety website or contact the Office of Boating Safety at 1-800-267-6687. A load limit is indicated in the boats made available to you and this maximum safety limit must be respected at all times.		
ANIMALS ON THE SITE		

 ${\bf Dogs\ on\ a\ leash}$  are allowed in the following places and campsites:

- Trails, picnic areas, undeveloped areas near a body of water and launching sites.

Anyone who breaches these rules may be required to leave the territory or be given an infraction notice, if applicable. Other pets are prohibited at all times.

Guide dogs and service dogs are allowed without restriction in all buildings and other places. However, they must be easily identifiable by wearing the scarf or

harness of the MIRA Foundation or of another recognized association, and be kept on a leash at all times. The code of ethics of the Foundation or of another recognized association must be respected by the people in charge of the dog, more specifically by keeping with them the letter of accreditation of the organization.

st Do not feed wild animals and avoid leaving organic waste on the site, except in the areas designated for these purposes.
